<p>Elder Charles Hoskins preached “Acceptable Sacrifice” using Genesis 4:1-12. Cain and Abel both sacrificed to God, but Abel’s sacrifice was acceptable to God. Cain’s sacrifice was of himself and Abel’s was of faith in obedience to God’s command. Heb. 11:4 says “Abel offered unto God a more excellent sacrifice than Cain.” God wants obedience. Cain’s offering was bloodless, work of his own hands, fruit of cursed ground and no faith. It was about his ego; himself. We must be of a broken heart and contrite spirit. Only when we sacrifice in faith and obedience to God will He accept it. Few people are not willing to give up luxuries and pleasures of life. They are selfish; they want to give offerings of their own choice. God’s way is not our way. Sacrifice is necessary in true worship. We must offer a sacrifice of praise to God continually. Romans 12:1 tells us to “present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God....”</p>	<p>Elder David Harris preached “The Wonders of Jesus” using Exodus 3:20 and Daniel 4:34. Our churches need to grow. People need to be filled with the Holy Ghost.</p>	<p>Pastor Joseph taught “Playing Possum” using II Kings chapter 5. Lay aside pride and humble yourself. A rich man is proud. He trusts in his own riches. Solomon had a chance to ask the Lord for anything. He asked for wisdom, not riches or fame. This pleased the Lord. We all need God’s help. Naaman was a mighty man in valour and a great man with his master, but he was a leper. He was also full of pride. He wanted Elisha the prophet to come out to him, and call upon God to heal him. But he was disappointed. He finally laid aside his pride and was healed of leprosy. He wanted to pay Elisha money for his healing, but Elisha refused. God didn’t want Naaman’s money; He wanted Naaman. People know that they are supposed to be dead to sin, yet, they pretend. They live a double life, coming to church but not dead to the world. That is playing possum. Put carnal nature to death every day. Apostle Paul said, “I die daily.” Don’t play possum – put carnality to death!</p>

DONALD: "H I J K L M N O"

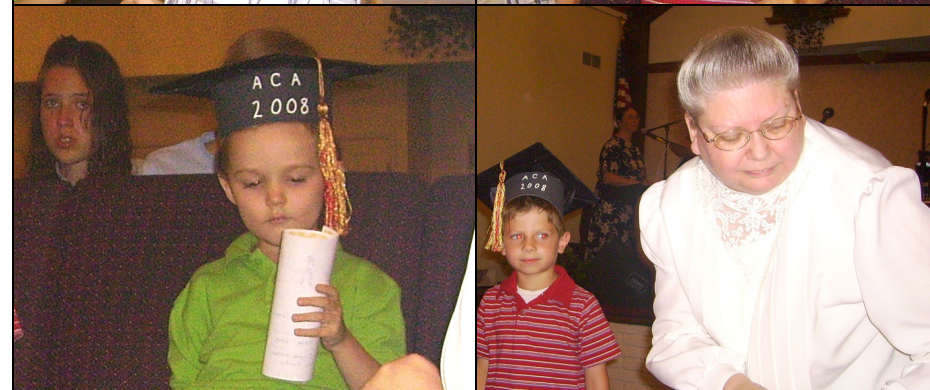
