The list of names (with proper titles) of the various leader-servants, heads of ministries, and other workers, streams down the side of our official stationary, giving deserved honor to hard-working members of CAC; a small thank-you to some people who do much for the Kingdom of God. It is only a feeble token of appreciation, yet proper titles are a valid and important way to show honor. This is an important way of helping people achieve victory over stifling feelings of inadequacy, displacement, and/or of being unappreciated or underappreciated. And (as one easily understands) sometimes we miss someone. For example, Brother Bud Sandy has a genuine burden for effective P.R. (public relations) efforts, with a proven track record of helping the church spread truth through evangelism means such as billboards, radio, parade participation, etc. He is CAC's defacto leader of our PR ministry. We learned to speak it affectionately and yet respectfully, as in answering the phone with "Hello, Elder! Did you know to..." and in sending emails with "Dear Elder:" at the top. All the so-called "modern" churches that don't call each other *Brother* or *Sister* are really throwing away something important. Jesus taught to not call religious leaders "Father" or "Master." So we don't. Also, I prefer to not be called "Reverend" and I do not want the biblical term *Pastor* to become another way of saying "Father." *Pastor Joseph* is OK, but *Brother Joseph* is quite good. Seek a balance of moderation.

Today marks 67 years since the dreadful Japanese air attack upon the US naval base at Pearl Harbor, Oahu, Hawaii, that precipitated the USA's official entrance into World War II.
