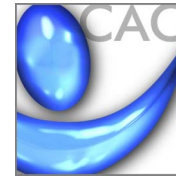

<p>Pastor Joseph taught our first installment in the ongoing character study of Abraham, using Hebrews 11:8-10 as his text. For all of the ages of man since the Creation, God has provided a dispensing of grace and an offer of salvation, requiring that man accept His offer and demonstrate true faith by obedience. In each and every age, only a few have chosen to obey. And in each and every one of these prior dispensations, it was the sin and wickedness of the disobedient that caused God to bring each age to an end. As long as there were more people who would be saved, the age would be left intact. But whenever God knew that only by changing the age could more people be saved, He ended the old age and began a new one. Just as Noah was the only one who would listen and obey, so it was also with Abram. God called him to leave the polytheistic, ungodly city of Ur of the Chaldees. Just as with Noah, Abram's obedience marked the start of a new age, that of the Patriarchs.</p>	<p>Bro. Pascal Crites preached "The Enemy Is Not After What You've Lost" using Job 1:14-22. Job was the wealthiest man in all the land. He had more sheep, goats, cows, camels, and servants than anyone. But his most precious possessions were not in material wealth. His most important treasures were his faith in God, his love of God, his dedication to God, and his worship and praise for God. The Lord knew that Job could be trusted to stand true, even if all the external treasures were taken away. God showed Job to Satan as an example of a faithful believer. The devil claimed that Job was only serving God to get blessings. To prove otherwise, the devil was permitted to attack Job by taking away everything except his life and his wife. Job was perplexed, but he stayed faithful. The things the devil stole were not what he was really after. He wanted to steal Job's godly faith, dedication, and praise. So it is with us. The devil is not after what he already stole, but rather what you still have!</p>	<p>Elder Joseph preached "Christmas All Year Round" using Matthew 5:43-48. There are at least two kinds of perfection. One is the pure perfection that only God has. The other kind is maturity; to be what is properly expected of you in your current place of development. We can actually hope to live up to this, with God's help. Through the ages, God has expected more and more maturity, as He has granted more help for development potential. The Bible called Job a "perfect" man simply because he was mature enough to serve God in the midst of trials. We read later that Job was somewhat self-righteous (not a good thing) but it did not prevent him being called "perfect" (i.e. as mature as he should have been at that point). Now that we have baptism of the Holy Ghost, God expects more of us. He expects us to not only love our neighbor, but to also love our enemies. God Himself does this: He gives the blessings of sunshine and rain on the just and the unjust.</p>
