The Scripture says they "all died in faith" without ever receiving the New Covenant baptism of the Spirit. If they could live and die like that without the Spirit of God indwelling them, how much more ought we who have the baptism of the Holy Ghost have the power to go on. Have faith! Love God and serve Him faithfully. Worship Him no matter what your surroundings or circumstances!</p>	<p>Pastor Joseph and Assoc. Pastor David Harris Jr. preached as a tag-team under the title "For His Name's Sake" using Ps. 105:1, I Sam. 12:22, Mark 16:15-18, and Rom. 8:35-39. We are blessed to know and use the Lord's name. 

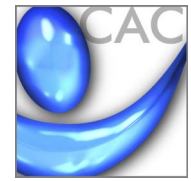

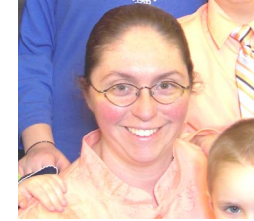
