



<p>Pastor Joseph taught about Joseph using Gen. 50:15-21. Joseph was a natural leader. He didn't participate in his brothers' misdeeds. They despised him for both that and because of their father's partiality to him. Their father, Jacob, was partial in giving to Joseph of a coat of many colors. It is unwise to show such overt favoritism. Finally Joseph's prophetic dreams of ruling over his brothers incensed them, and they sold him as a slave at the age of 17. God made him successful even as a slave. When his master's wife enticed him, he stood up for righteousness. He fled, yet she grabbed hold of his coat, and used it to lie against him. It was the second time his coat was used against him. He was then jailed. Yet God was at work, and Joseph stayed faithful. Eventually he was released and was made a ruler. He saved many people alive during a seven year famine. When his brothers came to buy food, <i>he forgave them!</i> They had meant evil to him but God meant it for good. When we think bad things are happening to us, it may be God working good for us. "All things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose" (Romans 8:28).</p>	<p>A visiting minister, Pastor Keith Fought, preached on the "Restoration of Joy" using Psalm 51:12 as his main text. When things go wrong, as they sometimes do in our lives, let us not get discouraged but let us praise the Lord. It's time to have your joy restored. Shout, dance, and clap your hands! Sing praises unto Him. Sing a new song unto the Lord; let everything that hath breath praise the Lord. God takes pleasure in the praises of His people. He takes pleasure when we dance before Him, when we shout and praise Him. David danced before the Lord as they brought the ark of the Lord into the city of David. What rejoicing! At the conclusion of his sermon many souls praised, shouted and danced before the Lord. Pastor Fought commended the CAC youth group for their worship of the Lord. What an awesome service!</p>	<p>Rev. Rusty Sandy and Pastor Joseph tag-teamed. Bro. Sandy preached from John 3:16. All that we are, and all that we ever hope to be, is because of what the Lord did for us on the cross. God loves us so much that He spared not His own son. This is the foundation of our existence. He has provided to us salvation, healing, fellowship, peace, holiness, and deliverance—all out of His great love. We must make sure that Jesus is our <i>everything</i>—our all in all.</p> <hr/> <p>Pastor Joseph read Hebrews 12:10, and 14, and spoke about aspects of peace and holiness. We are to <i>follow</i> peace and holiness, "without which no man shall see the Lord" (v. 14). Jesus is our peace, and Jesus is our holiness. It is only by following Him that we can have sufficient peace and adequate holiness. While following Him, at times we stray—so the Lord chastises us out of love. It is very unpleasant to be disciplined as a child of the Lord, but it is necessary so that we can be "partakers of his holiness" (v. 10). Following <i>holiness</i> permeates all of our existence and affects every area of our lives—clothing, speech, even Facebook posts!</p>

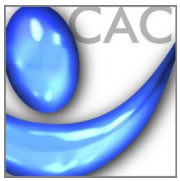

Cool facts as we celebrate Independence Day!

As we celebrate this great day, please consider the following facts you may not have known:



During the American Revolution, the legal separation of the American colonies from Great Britain occurred on July 2, 1776, when the Second Continental Congress voted to approve a resolution of independence that had been proposed in June of that year by Richard Henry Lee of Virginia. After voting for independence, Congress turned its attention to the Declaration of Independence, a statement explaining this decision, which had been prepared by a Committee of Five, with Thomas Jefferson as its principal author. Congress debated and revised the Declaration, finally approving it on July 4, 1776. A day earlier, John Adams had written to his wife Abigail:

"The second day of July, 1776, will be the most memorable epoch in the history of America. I am apt to believe that it will be celebrated by succeeding generations as the great anniversary festival. It ought to be commemorated as the day of deliverance, by solemn acts of devotion to God Almighty. It ought to be solemnized with pomp and parade, with shows, games, sports, guns, bells, bonfires, and illuminations, from one end of this continent to the other, from this time forward forever more."

Adams' prediction was off by two days. From the outset, Americans celebrated independence on July 4, the date shown on the much-publicized Declaration of Independence, rather than on July 2, the date the resolution of independence was approved in a closed session of Congress.

One of the most enduring myths about Independence Day is that Congress signed the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1776. The myth had become so firmly established that, decades after the event and nearing the end of their lives, even the elderly Thomas Jefferson and John Adams had come to believe that they and the other delegates had signed the Declaration on the fourth. Most delegates actually signed the Declaration on August 2, 1776. In a remarkable series of coincidences, John Adams and Thomas Jefferson, two founding fathers of the United States and the only two signers of the Declaration of Independence that went on to become president, both died on the same day: July 4, 1826, which was the United States' 50th anniversary.
