Pastor Joseph's Mother's Day message was from Genesis 3:40. Eve, the mother of all living, experienced all the joys and sorrows that all later mothers would know. She evidently had many sons and daughters, and probably lived to see many generations of grandchildren. With Adam, she had even known paradise, but sin had entered their lives when they rebelled against God's Word. God decreed, "In sorrow thou shalt bring forth children." Her greatest sorrow was no doubt when Cain slew Abel, and as with another mother whose Son's innocent blood was shed many years later, it was like a sword piercing her own soul (Luke 2:35). It seems likely that after Eve's first great sin, she later trusted and obeyed God's Word. Hopefully she was forgiven and saved. Later, as the mother of Seth, she taught him and her grandson, Enos, about the Lord and His promises. "Then began men to call upon the name of the Lord" (Genesis 4:26), which we still fulfill today (by water baptism in Jesus name). Many believers look forward to seeing their own mothers again someday, when they can restate their love and appreciation for all they did in bearing us, and in caring, teaching, and praying for us. But it will be a wonderful experience to meet our first mother, also, as well as Sarah, Hannah, Mary, and all the other godly mothers of old. If your mother is living, honor her always!
