Elder Keith Fought preached "Is Your Victory Hiding Behind Your Worship?" using I Samuel 21:1-9 as his text. In fear, David fled from Saul. He didn't even take food or weapons. Yet he knew where to run: to the house of God! There he found refuge, food and a weapon—just what he needed for victory. The weapon was the sword of Goliath, the giant that David had slain previously. It was located under the ephod — a priestly symbol of worship. Worship doesn't come after the victory but before the victory! Before David could pick up the sword (his victory), he had to first pick up the worship. We must not rely on our own strength, but trust in the Lord and worship Him! Other texts cited: Mark 10:46-52 & Mark 5:6-13.

Elder Lorren Godwin preached "Singing the Lord's song in a strange land" from Psalms 137:4. Whenever Israel was under attack or taken captive, and when they called out to God, He heard them and answered. When we are in a battle or facing a situation, we need to remember that calling on God first is the key to victory. Too many times we accept defeat when victory was in reach by simply crying out to God. God is never deaf or asleep. He will always answer when we cry out to Him. Every time God's people called to Him in sincerity, He always answered. The question is will we call out to Him? Too often we neglect to turn to Him, and we suffer defeat when victory was ours for the asking. The children of Israel were in Babylon, which means confusion. They hung their harps on the willow trees, which means darkness. Their enemy had them wrapped in confusion. As a result, they hid their praise in a dark place, meaning they weren't sure what to do so they gave up on God. But even if the devil has us confused and tells us there is no hope, we have no reason to hide our praise! Cry out to Him and watch the battle turn from confusion and darkness to a mighty victory through Jesus Christ!

Last Wednesday

Jr. Elder Baron Claypool preached "When Jesus Stands Still" using Mark 10:46-52. The same crowd that alerted Bartimaeus that Jesus was coming, also later demanded that the blind man be quiet. Many in the religious world are the same today; claiming that one needs Jesus—yet scolding if we get too hungry or "go overboard" in seeking Him. Only when Bartimaeus truly cried out to Jesus did the Lord stand still. In the day that we seek for Him with all our heart, He will be found of us. Jesus instructed that blind Bartimaeus be called. No verse indicates anyone led the blind man. He seems to have come on his own. We walk by faith and not by sight! Bartimaeus cast off his beggar's coat, making a clean break from his past life. Jesus healed him and told him to go his own way, yet he insisted on following Jesus in the way. Don't just get what you need and then leave. We ought to be determined to follow the Lord and learn from Him! Elder Lorren Godwin preached about the Lord's power and compassion. The

disciples were in a ship, afraid during a terrible storm, when Jesus came walking on the water. Peter called to Him. When Jesus invited, Peter climbed out and started walking to Him on the water. When Peter focused on the wind and waves, he lost his miracle. He took his eyes off Jesus and began to sink. He remembered Jesus, and called out. Jesus immediately saved him. David left Israel after King Saul tried to take his life. David ran to King Achish, in Gath. The people there remarked, "Isn't this David whom they sang has killed ten thousands while Saul his king killed thousands?" David feigned himself as insane so they would not see him as a threat. He began to remember what God had done through him and began to worship the Lord and celebrate past & future victories. Achish means to terrify and darken; Gath means wine press. David ran in fear, but when he arrived at the place where he was crushed, he changed back to the worshiping servant of God and became victorious again.

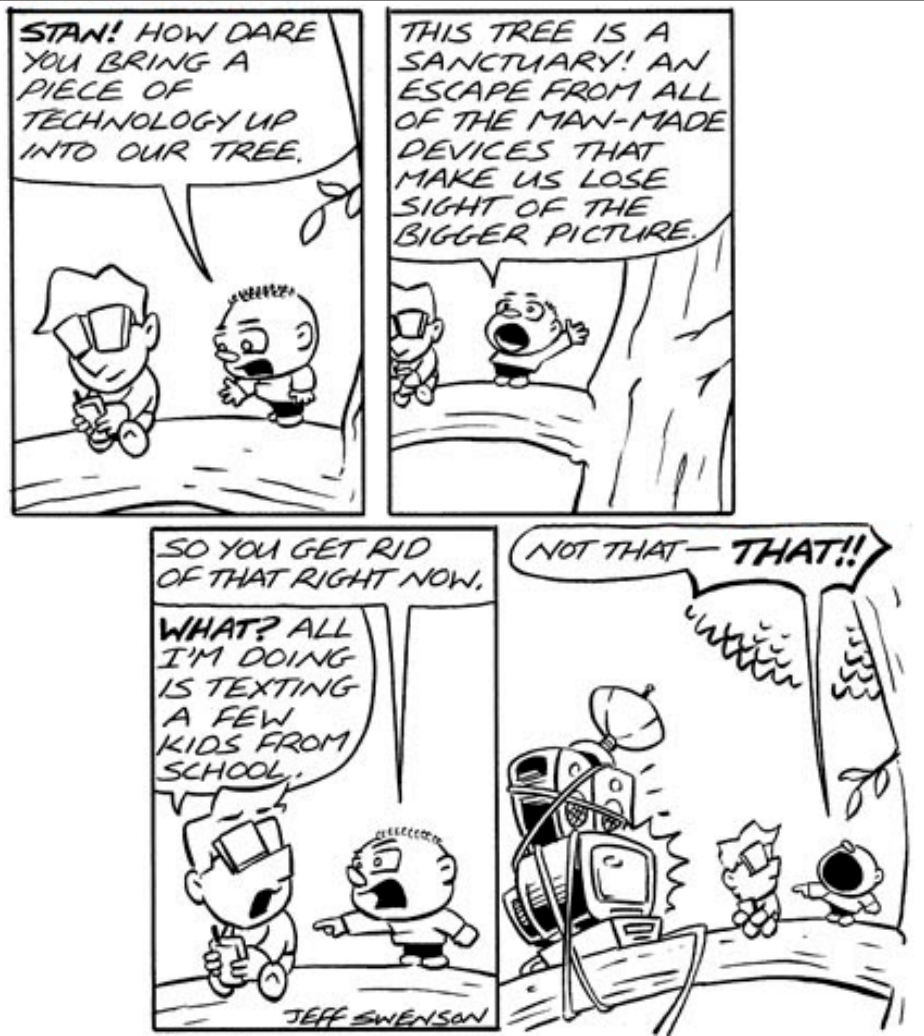

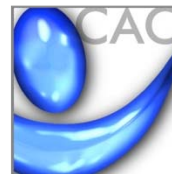
