## Sunday AM

Pastor Joseph preached a message on thankfulness, entitled "God Has Done Great Things" from Ps. 126:1-3, Ps. 136, and Ps. 118. We have a reason to give thanks. Our God is great, and He has done great things. Our God is omnipotent. He is the God of gods and Lord of lords, Ps. 136:1-3. He is the creator of everything, Ps. 136:4-9. He is the miracle worker. Our God cares for us; He is our deliverer, Ps. 136:10-22, and He is our provider, Ps. 136:23-26. He is at work in our midst, Ps. 126:1-3. Our salvation and our church are a dream come true. God has placed laughter and singing in our lives. Others can see what God is doing among us. We must not boast, but we should confess what God is doing. We are glad! Elder Hoskins gave a testimony of healing, Sister Morris gave testimony of visions, and Pastor Joseph told more personal testimonies of miraculous deliverance and of visions. God is blessing our church with progress. Have faith now! It's your turn! Praise Him for what He has done and will do!

## Sunday PM

Pastor Joseph preached "Date With Destiny" from I Samuel 24:1-22, and 25:1. The future king, David, suffered much while the present king, Saul, was wrongfully hunting him. At one point David had to pretend to be insane in front of Abimelech, who drove him away. Regarding that time the psalmist wrote, "I will bless the LORD at all times: his praise shall continually be in my mouth." What a great attitude David had about his unjust suffering. It is perhaps not a coincidence that after Saul and David reached a tentative peace during a "chance" meeting at a cave, the very next verse of the Bible says that Samuel, the aged prophet, finally died. It was as though he was hanging onto life until knowing David gained some peace with Saul. The cave was destined for those important moments. For David and his few hundred men, it seemed like a place of shelter. For Saul, who was hunting David with 3,000 of his men, it seemed like a place to relieve himself. Thus it became a place that separated Saul from his troops, and subjected him unawares to David, whose men said, 'This is your chance to get him!' (so to speak). David had wisdom, and resolved to not harm Saul. He decided that if God wanted Saul brought down, it had to be someone else who would do it. He respected the office, had mercy on the man, and showed godly love.

## Wednesday

Jr. Elder Zach Sandy preached about daily consecration, using Matthew 26:41. The spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak. This is true for all, yet it is no excuse for sin. It's not just a matter of what you do, but what you do after you are with the Lord. Jesus said we would have trouble in the world, but He has overcome the world! For us to overcome, doesn't it make sense for us to stay in communication with our Lord who has already overcome? We need daily prayer, weekly fasting, regular Bible reading and church attendance. If we allow Him to empower us, we accomplish anything He needs us to! Paul said, "I die daily." We must also!

Elder Baron Claypool preached "What Yoke Are You Wearing?" from Isa 10:27. The anointing destroys the yoke of bondage. Everyone is going to be yoked, either with the Lord, or with sin. The verse about not being unequally yoked with unbelievers applies to much more than marriage. Being unequally yoked with sin makes the plow go in circles. When you are yoked with the enemy, you will be forced in directions you were never meant to go. Jesus promised: "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light" (Mat. 11:28-30).

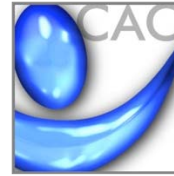
