Sunday AM

Pastor Joseph preached "The Right Source" from Acts 3:1-10 & Deut. 14:24-25. While all the Mosaic Law is inspired by God and worthy of study by all believers, Gentile believers are not signatories of the Sinai Covenant, and as such were never part of the Mosaic Covenant. Even Jews of today cannot keep all of the old law, in part because modern-day Israel is a democracy, not a theocracy. Many aspects of their covenant (such as the food list in Deut. 14) are bound to the people of that covenant. Our New Covenant has a new, different practice for us regarding foods. Though we are under the Law of Christ instead, we can still learn life lessons from the old law, and study God's character. The old law reveals timeless principles and unchanging moral judgments by God. He's always desired a holy, peculiar people. We are to live holy so others will see God in us. There is a difference between the law stating that a thing is "an abomination to *you* (people)" and stating that a thing is "an abomination to *God*." Since God never changes, anything He once hated, He still hates. (One such practice He hates is a lack of clear gender distinction in clothing.) People must come to the right source to receive something from God. **We have power in Jesus' name.** Don't ask "What's in it for me?" but "What can I do for others?" We can receive power when we go the right source.

Sunday PM

Bishop Joseph Roberts of India testified of "Benefits Of The Prayer" using Job 21:15. In India, Hindus see Jesus Christ as a "foreign god." Yet because God is doing miracles, Christianity is growing there. Due to the growth, Christians are being persecuted. If anyone converts, all government assistance to him/her stops. Christians are often unable to get jobs. Bishop Roberts' father was a Pentecostal preacher. Their home endured hunger and poverty. As a child, the young Roberts pondered what benefit there was in prayer. He eventually opposed Christianity. He ran away from home. He was arrested and put in jail, but his parents continued to pray. After his release, his enemies tried to kill him. He became deathly ill. He decided to pray. God miraculously touched him. He saw the benefit of prayer and became a new man. He survived sickness and his enemies through the benefit of his parents' prayers. He has received protection, direction, healing and blessings.

Wednesday

Elder Hannah Sandy preached "The Struggle" from II Cor. 12:9-10. We struggle every day—job, family, issues. Our nation is one of stress, anxiety and depression. There are broken people all around us. We need to pray for others while going through our own. There is a purpose for each struggle we go through. God uses our struggles to teach us lessons. He knows the beginning and the end of our trials. Elder Les Benedum preached "My People" from II Chronicles 7: 12-14. When God says "my people," He means all, not just one denomination. There are barriers coming down. People are humbling themselves and setting aside differences in order to pray together.

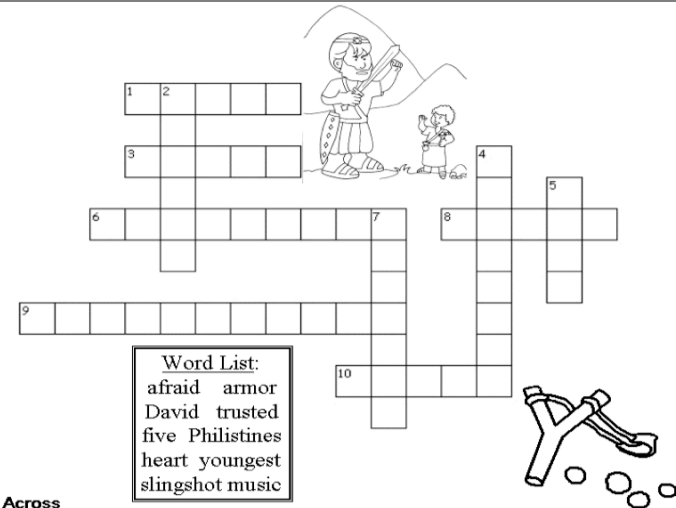

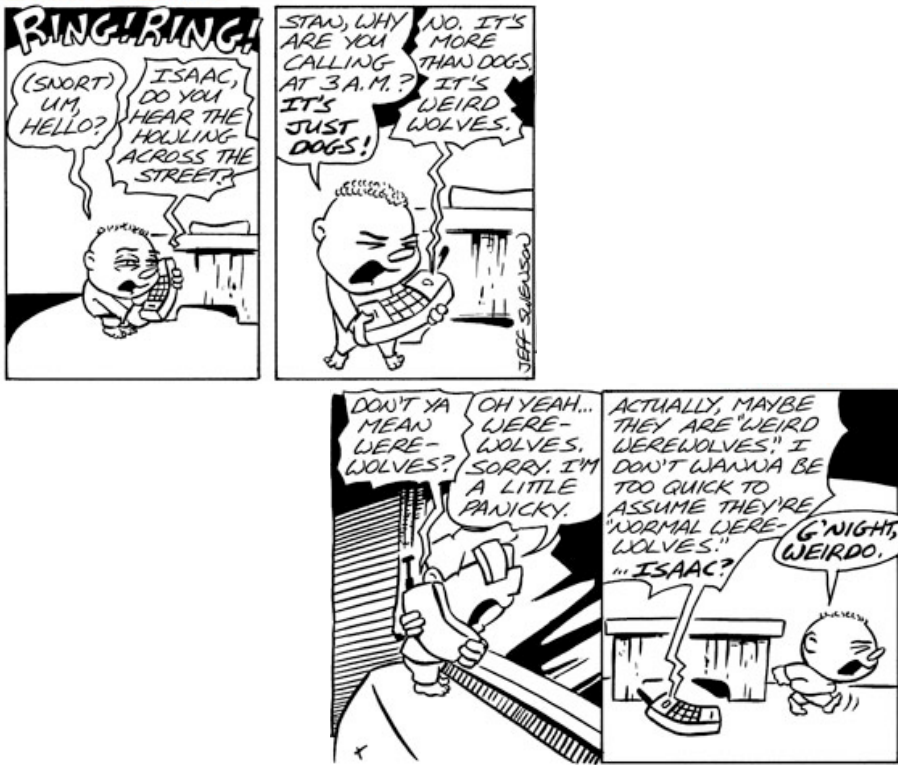

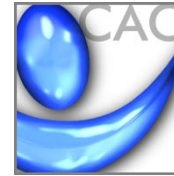
