Pastor Joseph delivered an election message, using Isaiah 41:1-4 and other verses. God intervenes in the affairs of man, including affecting politics, very often using people to do so. When we are faced with very flawed candidates, we can weigh both their policy views and their party's platform in our voting decisions. One of the most important policy issues for this presidential election is future appointment of Supreme Court justices and scores of federal judges. Many crucial issues have been decided by a SCOTUS vote of 5-4. Judicial appointments will affect our country and, thus, our children and grandchildren for many years (if the Lord tarries). Each vote matters. We must vote even if it is for the lesser of two evils. Inaction is not necessarily right or good. Biblically, inaction can be a sin. Voting for a candidate is exercising your power as a citizen. It is not an endorsement of everything done previously. Church members, including pastors, have the right to freedom of speech. This election is very important. Do your duty and vote!

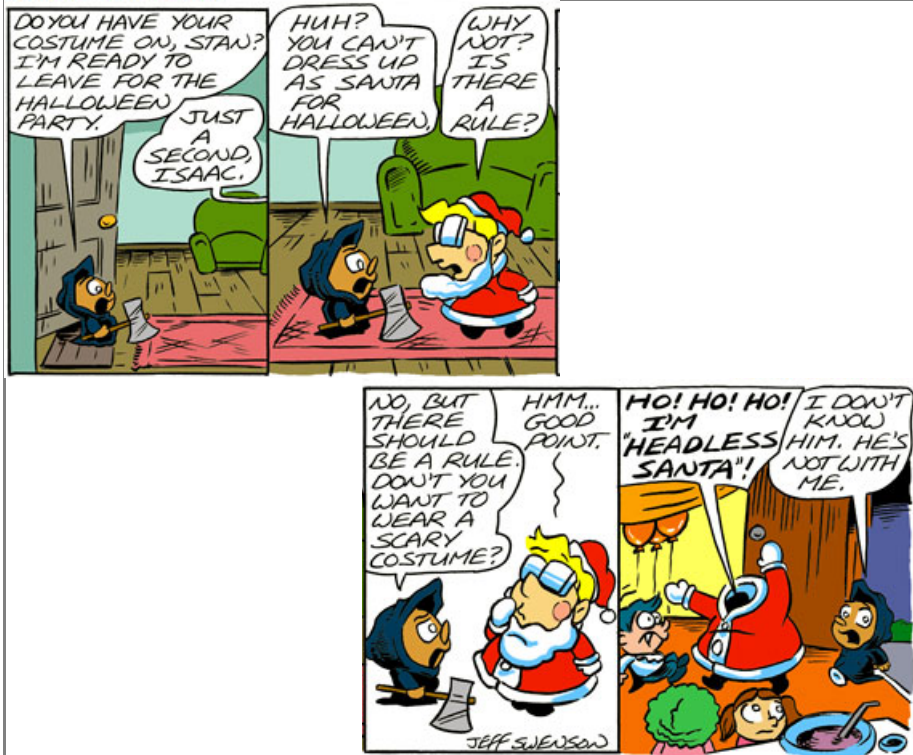

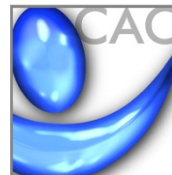

Personal election note from Pastor Doug Joseph:



Americans, including West Virginians, are voting early in record numbers. One estimate is that 40% of all ballots may be cast early. Indications are that voting early could help your candidate. Whether you vote early or on November 8, be sure to personally verify that your vote choices match the tally shown on your ballot. As a Christian, I encourage you to vote biblical values. I'm voting Pro-Life, Pro-Israel, Pro-Constitution, including Pro-2nd Amendment, etc. The next president will likely get to appoint multiple Supreme Court justices and scores of federal judges. The worldview of those appointees will determine America's judicial climate for a generation (if the Lord tarries). Whatever you do, fellow believer, don't stay home this election. You can obtain a voter guide from West Virginians for Life, to know which candidates are Pro-Life. We have some available here, or simply visit wvforlife.org and then click on "Political" and click the "Full Endorsement List of 2016 Candidates." Below are some endorsements from that list.
